- Class 3 will consider the history of trade policy.
- In Class 4 we will discuss the era of globalization
- Class 5 will end the course with a consideration of events leading up to the global financial crisis and possible scenarios for the future.

The readings focus on contemporary writings in the field but we also read several classic works, especially on theoretical approaches. Students need not have a background in international economics to complete this course satisfactorily, but those not familiar with basic economic principles might need to do some background reading.

The required textbook for this course is Jeffrey A. Frieden, David A. Lake and J. Lawrence Broz, eds. (FL). *International Political Economy: Perspectives on Global Power and Wealth*, 6th ed. WW Norton 2017.

The class is quite reading intensive, and some weeks will require you to digest lots of material. To do this effectively, it's important for students to remember that reading political science is not like reading a novel. You should approach each article or chapter with the same questions:

- What is the main argument that the author is trying to make?
- How is the author supporting this argument?
- What debate or question is the author trying to address?
- Does the author engage other positions in the debate and what arguments does he use to refute them?
- What evidence does the author use to support his argument?
