課程概述 Course Description (Required. At least 50 Chinese characters or 200 English letters.) This is a compulsory course for first year graduate students. This semester the course will focus on formulating dissertation proposals, generating bibliographies, doing preliminary research, reviewing and creating a dissertation outline. It will also equip students with the skills required to search for and contribute to conferences and apply for funding.

課程目標 Course Objectives (Required.)

To engage students in the long-term process of researching, writing and revising for their dissertations to give them the best opportunity of producing a polished dissertation in their graduating year.

課程要求 Requirements (Optional)

In the first week students should have an idea of what they might like to focus on for their dissertations.

参考書目(教科書) Textbook and References (Required)

Much of the material to be used in class will be generated by the students. There are a number of useful general guides for researchers. Derek Pugh, *How to Get a Ph.D.* OUP, 2005 offers good advice for graduate students as well as a bibliography for help with different aspects of researching and writing. Also recommended is Rowena Murray, *How to Write a Thesis*. OUP, 2006. Joseph M.Williams, *Style: Ten Lessons in Clarity and Grace* 9th ed. Longman, 2006, is useful for sharpening up academic prose. A course pack of study skills will be provided.
